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1. Resume and Cover Letter

Designed to assist individuals to prepare and understand what is an effective Resume and Cover Letter. A resume and cover letter is your introduction to a future employer. This workshop will help you create a winning resume and cover letter and increase your chances of landing a job interview

2. Interview Skills

Interviews are important and learning the basics of how to succeed in an interview may help you land your dream job. This workshop will allow you to learn some basic tips, and discover different ways to deal with the pressure of an interview of the tougher interview questions often encountered.

3. Job Search Strategies

Your new job is out there – you just need to know where to find it! This workshop will introduce you to both traditional and non-traditional methods of job searching, including the power of networking and cold calling.

4. Job Retention and Maintenance

You've landed that dream job, now how to keep it! This workshop will provide tips and information to participants about the skills, knowledge and behavior necessary to succeed in their new found employment.

5. Introduction to Second Career

Second Career provides laid-off workers with skills training to help them find jobs in high-demand occupations in Ontario. If you have been laid off and unable to obtain substantial employment, this workshop will review suitability and eligibility criteria along with details around the process of applying for funding and client expectations around the Second Career program.

6. Apprenticeship

Apprenticeships are an often forgotten option for post-secondary education. An apprentice learns a job by working with a skilled supervisor in that area as well as attending some technical classroom training. This workshop will introduce you to the different types of apprenticeships available, basic requirements, and how to register as an apprentice with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).

7. Employment Standards Act

The Employment Standards Act sets out the rights of employees and requirements that apply to employers in most Ontario workplaces. Fairness in the workplace is your right.

8. Canadian Culture & Etiquette

Designed Canadian Culture & Etiquette for Newcomers; Before beginning a volunteer or work placement, find out what you're walking into so you're better prepared to be a success. Educate yourself on the many office protocols before you start your first day! Come and learn about what to expect in the Canadian workplace environment.

9. LinkedIn: Your Online Job Search

This workshop will allow you to familiarize yourself with the use of the social media site LinkedIn, and how it can be used for your job search. The strengths and advantages of using this site will be examined, and the use of specific features on LinkedIn will be reviewed to help job seekers maximize the effectiveness of this site.

10. CNC Machinist Hiring Program

This session provides youth, between ages 18-29, information on paid training and certification while working with innovative technologies at firms across York Region and access to permanent in demand positions in advanced manufacturing.



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
